# 2016 Legislative Session –Marijuana Bills

Bill/Companion Bill	Title/Description
HB 1438	Permitting cities, towns, and counties to prohibit the production, processing, and sale of marijuana under Initiative Measure No. 502 only by public vote— <b>Executive Action taken on 1/18/2016</b>
HB 2347	Reducing the tax on useable marijuana, marijuana concentrates, and marijuana-infused products-- <b>Executive Action taken on 1/26/2016.</b>
HB 2365	Allowing marijuana retailers to sell marijuana merchandise.
HB 2368	Creating a two-year pilot program authorizing up to five qualified licensed marijuana retailers to deliver marijuana to Washington residents in a city with a population of over six hundred fifty thousand.
HB 2693	Establishing a marijuana lounge endorsement to a marijuana retailer's license.
SB 6375	Modifying marijuana club provisions—allows cities, towns, and local municipalities to establish a licensing process.
HB 2522/SB6302	Establishing crimes related to minors entering, remaining in, or being served by a marijuana retail outlet.
HB 2494/SB6486	Concerning penalties for marijuana offenses. Establishes penalties for possession by persons under 21. Establishes clarification for allowable amounts in WA and penalties related to violating possession of amounts in excess of allowable amounts.

# 2016 Legislative Session—Marijuana Bills (continued)



Bill/Companion Bill	Title/Description
HB 2584	Concerning public disclosure of information submitted to the liquor and cannabis board regarding marijuana product traceability and operations.
HB 2629	Concerning the possession and transfer of marijuana, marijuana plants, useable marijuana, marijuana-infused products, and marijuana concentrates.
HB 2696	Concerning the sale of marijuana plants and seeds for medical purposes.
HB 2802/SB6341	Concerning the provision of personal services and promotional items by cannabis producers and processors. (SB6341 does not define “nominal value”, HB2802 defines nominal value as up to \$30.00)
SB 6207	Concerning public disclosure of information submitted to the liquor and cannabis board regarding marijuana product traceability and operations.
HB 2520/SB6304	Concerning the sale of marijuana to regulated cooperatives (from producers and processors).
SB 6303/HB2521	Allowing for proper disposal of unsellable marijuana by a licensed marijuana retail outlet.



# 2016 Legislative Session—Bills related to Tobacco, Vaping , Alcohol & Mental Health.

Bill/Companion Bill	Title/Description
<b>HB 2313/SB6157</b>	Concerning the age of individuals at which sale or distribution of tobacco and vapor products may be made.
<b>HB 2588/SB6328</b>	Concerning vapor products in respect to provisions concerning certain child-resistant packaging, definitions related to "vapor product," signage requirements prohibiting vapor product sales to minors, prohibition of the purchase and possession of vapor products by minors, the liquor and cannabis board's enforcement authority over vapor products, preemption of certain local regulation of vapor products, and a requirement for vendor-assisted sales of vapor products in retail establishments.
SB 6236	Concerning the 24/7 sobriety program.
SB 6470	Concerning the regulation of alcoholic beverages.
ESHB 1448/SB5781	Providing procedures for responding to reports of threatened or attempted suicide.
HB 1900	Defining the role of the school counselor, social worker, and psychologist. Revised for 1st Substitute: Concerning school counselors, social workers, and psychologists.
HB 2373/SB6432	Making provisions to evaluate student mental health services and provide students with skills that promote mental health and well-being and increase academic performance.
<b>HB 2793</b>	Providing for suicide awareness and prevention education for safer homes.
SB 6243	Concerning a training program for educators and parents to develop students' social and emotional skills to help prevent youth suicide.
