About the Community Prevention and Wellness Initiative (CPWI)

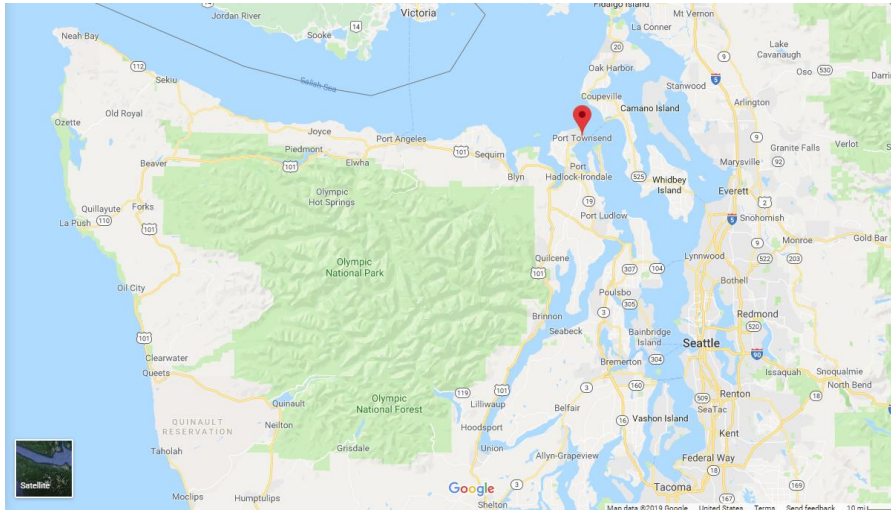
CPWI is a partnership of state agencies, counties, schools and local prevention coalitions supporting communities in preventing alcohol and other drug abuse and its negative consequences. CPWI priorities include reducing underage drinking, marijuana use and opioid misuse/abuse among middle and high school aged youth. By providing evidence-based practices and promoting the positive changes in communities, we can build healthier communities.

About the Coalition: Communities & Schools Working Together

The Port Townsend Prevention Coalition is a collaboration with the Port Townsend School District and the Olympic Educational Service District 114, and is funded by the Health Care Authority Department of Behavioral Health and Recovery. Jefferson County Public Health provides fiscal oversight of the Coalition's state and federal funding.

The Port Townsend Prevention Coalition is a volunteer alcohol, tobacco, and other drug prevention advocacy organization that brings community members together to reduce youth substance misuse and abuse in the geographic area specific to the Port Townsend School District. Members represent 12 community sectors including youth, parents, schools, businesses, healthcare professionals, youth-serving agencies, civic/volunteer groups, local government, religious/fraternal organizations, media, and law enforcement. Volunteers guide decision making, evaluate data, participate in direct service opportunities, and promote the Coalition's efforts in their community sectors.

About Our Community

Port Townsend is a historic Victorian Seaport in East Jefferson County on the Olympic Peninsula in Washington State. The Port Townsend School District had an annual average enrollment for the 2017-2018 school year of 1,175 students, with a community population of 14,996. Situated on the northeastern most extent of the Olympic Peninsula- the Quimper Peninsula, Port Townsend is uniquely influenced by maritime culture, tourism, and the agricultural developments of Jefferson County.

The Port Townsend School District student enrollment information shows that the student population is more diverse than the community at large; October enrollment 2017 in Port Townsend schools includes 1.2% American Indian/Alaskan Native, 2.2% Asian, 1.3% Black/African American, 8.1% Hispanic/Latino of any race(s), 0.3% Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander, 82% White, and 4.9% Two or more races.

About Prevention Programs in our Community

Goals

- Decrease favorable attitudes toward substance use
- Decrease community norms favorable to youth substance use
- Decrease perceptions of community and law enforcement and norms favorable to youth substance use
- Decrease the availability of substances, including perceived availability among teens
- Reduce community disorganization, increase attitudes of family management practices

Strategies- School based substance use education, evidence-based parenting program, positive social norms campaign, public awareness campaign, vaping in public places policy investigation, Nurse Family Partnership program, community engagement
