About Our Community About Prevention Programs in our Community

Tumwater is located along the lower stretch of the Deschutes River and is the southern gateway to the Puget Sound region, neighbor to the state's capital, Olympia, located between Seattle and Portland. Residents of the Tumwater area, including several rural places in the school district, work in government, service (accommodation, food, etc.) and retail sectors, and enjoy ready access to abundant recreational opportunities.

Tumwater School District has an enrollment of over 6,700 students and covers a total of 117 square miles. Students attend classes at one of six elementary schools, two middle schools or four high schools (with two comprehensive, two alternative learning programs). The school district is a valued partner in prevention.

The Coalition targets all forms of substance use among youth in Tumwater. Additionally, Tumwater HOPES recognizes an increase in youth anxiety, depression, and suicidal ideation. Families are struggling. The pandemic has had lasting effects for many people.

Youth substance use is often a symptom of a larger problem. By promoting health and well-being, through education and skills building at all levels, Tumwater HOPES ambitiously works to reduce risk and harm from high-risk decisions about drugs and alcohol. Our youth coalition, Thurston Hopes 4 Everyone Everywhere (THEE) club, tackles critical concerns through advocacy and youth participatory research.

Tumwater HOPES fosters key relationships in the community to implement innovative and evidence-based programs and support youth engagement. Schools, community organizations, law enforcement, parents, and youth are working to influence identified factors. Today's youth are tomorrow's future.
