



# 2021 Legislative Update

---

- ▶ 2021 Regular Session Continues
- ▶ First Milestone Reached: February 15<sup>th</sup>. Bills need to be out of their policy committee of origin.
- ▶ Second Milestone Reached- February 22<sup>nd</sup> . Bills need to be out of a fiscal committees (Appropriations-House, Ways & Means-Senate) in the house of origin.
- ▶ Third Milestone – March 9<sup>th</sup>. Bills need to be out of the house of origin.
- ▶ DBHR bills tracking –
  - ▶ (25) Bills - Do Pass for 1<sup>st</sup> Milestone
  - ▶ (20) Bills – Do Pass for 2<sup>nd</sup> Milestone
- ▶ HCA 400 Bills - DBHR reviewed/analyzed about 35 bills
