

Developmental Theory of Embodiment

[W]ithin a period of 5 years or so (ages 8-13), associated with puberty, the social environment of girls changes such that they become acculturated to inhabit their bodies with **diminished agency, disrupted connection to desire, reduced self-attunement, and greater self-objectification**. These compounded losses undermine girls' ability to act in the world with power (Piran, 2017a, p. 261)





Empowering youth to explore, appreciate, and embody their authentic selves, through movement, social connection, and self-reflection.

We welcome 11 – 14 year olds who identify as girls and are inclusive of cisgender, transgender, and non-binary youth of all races, ethnicities, abilities, and body sizes.

1. Practicing strategies that support ***body appreciation*** targeting physical abilities, functioning, and appearance.


2. Engaging in ***mindfulness*** practices.



CPWI Updates: Contract Negotiations

- ▶ DBHR, the Association of the Educational Service Districts (AESD), and ESD leadership meet in April to discuss school-based services Contract.
- ▶ Coalition Contract Negotiations to take place at May 24th Learning Community Meeting.
 - ▶ Please ensure contract contact, fiscal staff, and any other key individuals are also planning to attend.
- ▶ As in past years, we anticipate reviewing key changes together while also allowing opportunity for each Contractor to provide feedback.
- ▶ There are some key considerations we are hoping to implement that would significantly reduce administrative burden and have a positive impact!
 - ▶ This is all thanks to your feedback and efforts!


CPWI Updates: Contract Negotiations



- ▶ Master Contracts, often referred to as “umbrella contracts,” that allows for multiple Work Orders underneath.
 - ▶ These allow for development of future agreements that are tied back to a primary Contract.
 - ▶ Often used as part of a long-term partnership when the delivery of service is ongoing.
- ▶ Master Contract with a standard maximum consideration across service type that allows for adding/removing funding without having to complete a formal contract amendment.
- ▶ Reviewing fund sources and allocations to seek simplification wherever possible.
- ▶ Raising admin/indirect from 8% to 10% and providing additional clarity on how this allocation is expected to be utilized.
- ▶ Dedicated Cannabis Account programmatic changes based upon changes in the RCW.

Minerva

- ▶ Happy 1 Year Anniversary Minerva 2.0!
- ▶ Between March, 2022 and now, we have done the following things:
 - ▶ Added over 100 new users through the New User Request process
 - ▶ Trained over 200 people
 - ▶ Hosted over 20 Technical Assistance calls and trainings
 - ▶ Entered over 10,000 services

▶ Biennial Data Refresh

▶ Biennium dates

- Current: July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2023
- Incoming: **July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2025**

▶ Background

- The biennium has historically served as a catalyst for opportunity to “start fresh” on setting up profiles, programs, and data entry for providers.
- As we launched M2 we have gone through a *developing* and *learning* phases. We are now moving to that *stabilizing* phase.

▶ Purpose and Approach

- Review and improve upon existing data entry policies and practices so that we can refine current data for the duration of the incoming biennium.
- Provide training, TA, and instruction for all providers to clean up accounts and enter new set-up for data entry for the biennium.
- All Accounts current data is archived and new contracts, logic models, programs, etc. are set up.







Important dates

House of Origin

- ▶ **January 9:** 1st day of session
- ▶ **February 17th:** Policy committee cutoff (Day 40)
- ▶ **February 24th:** Fiscal Committee cutoff (Day 47)
- ▶ **March 8th:** House of Origin Cutoff (Day 59)

Cross over (process repeats)

- ▶ **March 29th :** Policy committee cutoff (Day 80)
- ▶ **April 4th:** Fiscal committee cutoff (Day 86)
- ▶ **April 12th:** Last day to consider bills UNLESS Necessary to Implement the budget (NTIB)



Key Terms/Concepts

- ▶ Necessary to implement the budget (NTIB): Bills that the budget relies on in order to be complete (i.e., revenue, fiscal impact)
- ▶ 'Null and void' unless funded
- ▶ Economic forecast and budget revisions
 - ▶ Forecast: March 20th
 - ▶ Senate Budget: March 24th
 - ▶ House Budget: March 27th

Regulating Chemically Created Cannabinoids: E2SSB 5367

- ▶ Derived from hemp
 - ▶ Legal due to technicality in federal law
- ▶ Sold online, at gas stations, and in grocery stores
 - ▶ Not age restricted
 - ▶ Often not clearly labeled
 - ▶ Can contain residual chemicals from processing
- ▶ E2SSB 5367
 - ▶ Draws a line for THC content and expands definition of THCs
 - ▶ Products with 'any' THC content must be sold in cannabis retailers

Preventing use of vapor & tobacco products by minors: E2SSB 5365

- ▶ Since TV21 went into effect, a disparity in the tobacco possession law exists:
 - ▶ 18–21: no penalties
 - ▶ Below 18: civil infraction
- ▶ Current enforcement disproportionately affects BIPOC
- ▶ E2SSB 5365 eliminates financial penalties for youth
 - ▶ Increases penalties for retailer violations
 - ▶ Maintains civil infraction classification and requires demographic data to be collected






SUD Funding in Washington State State Funding Only






Local Services - CBOs Budget

Px Funding Diagram: CPWI funding over time




