Grant updates

- **DCYF**- Preschool grant E-cap, home visit (Judy King, Kelly Bohannan are contacts)
- **HCA**- STR extension submitted
- **DOH**- Renewals 1815, coordinated chronic disease, arthritis, state physical and nutrition.
- **DFC**- Not out yet

Agency Updates

- **DOH**- Not many changes, looking forward to Francis's return. HYS data coming next week.
 - **Tobacco & Vapor** Public health law center, resignation of FDA commissioner, + Graphic warning labels for tobacco going to move forward
 - **MJ Prevention** Kristin Halley- back at full capacity, Cristal Connelly- working part time
- **DCYF**- Youth engagement working with communities, young people teaching adults, advisory committees, mentorship
- **WASAP**- Tracking legislation, MJ billboard ban information available.
 - WASAP training, cert board website (April, Yakima)
- **HCA**-
 - Cohort 6 is up and rolling, working on strategic plans due April 1.
 - All CPWI communities due action plans June 15.
 - Lots of bill analysis on mj, tobacco, alcohol, etc.
 - HYS press release next week (hopefully Monday), Mental health and suicide press release next month, OSPI press release on school climate.
 - HYS 2020 item survey development underway. Anyone who wants to be a part of that there will be meetings and a presentation.
 - Young Adult Health Survey (18-25) YAHS finalizing report, will be presented here.

Presentation: Intervening to Prevent driving under the influence – Shelley Baldwin, Washington Traffic Safety Commission

- People's attitudes towards driving under influence of marijuana and liquor
- Traffic Safety Culture
- Target zero
 - State goal to have zero driving under the influence
- DUI is leading cause of vehicle deaths in WA

- Alcohol and polysubstance use has increased as a contributor
- There was a survey
 - Only asked about marijuana and alcohol
 - Two biggest and easiest to study at this time
- What can you do
 - Share the information
 - Integrating information into programs, strategies and communications
 - Grow bystander engagement intervention

Tobacco 21 – Mary McHale, Kelly Richburg

- Bill proposed in 2015
 - Passed the house last year and this year
- Hearing in the Senate this week
- Higher legal age reduces smoking when older
- Other states and many cities have implemented legal age of 21
- WA decrease in cigarette smoking increase in vaping
- Campaign update
 - Agency requested legislation DOH and AGO
 - Same language
 - Increases age from 18-21 for tobacco and vapor products
 - Does NOT increase possession penalties for 18-20
 - 12 mil fiscal cost
 - Broad base of support
 - HB 1074
 - Rep Paul Harris
 - Passed out of committee into appropriation
 - 66/30
 - Bi-Partisan bill
 - Heading to Senate Ways and Means
 - SB 5057
 - Passed Senate Health
 - Not the only thing that needs to be done
 - Will help curb access
 - Prevention at DOH underfunded
 - We are in need of prevention programs
 - Update on Vapor bills
 - 2 tax bills
 - 1873 E-cigarette tax bill
 - Tax at a 95% wholesale price
 - Hearing in house finance committee
 - Only those that contain nicotine
 - Rev would go to gen fund
 - 70% public health services acct-1st biennium

- 60% public health services acct- any time after 1st biennium
- Sub bill in the works
 - % of funds to possibly be delegated to prevention programs

Leg Updates

- Watching for alcohol moving through leg.
 - Fairgrounds, Soju and theaters
 - Bills chipping away at tiered system
 - Making and selling intermingling
 - Types of alcohol intermingling
 - Alcohol edging into 'family' environments
- Watching for Marijuana
 - Chipping away at policies that seem to be helping with keeping youth use down
 - Billboards banning HB 1466
 - WASAP put out an action alert
 - Hemp possibly moving to AG
 - Limit on LCB rulemaking
 - There is a rulemaking out as of now at LCB
 - Privately owned raceways/stadiums can have billboards
 - Still moving
